

## When can a consumer return to Community Day Services?

Individual	Showing Symptoms	No Symptoms
Not Tested for COVID-19 <b>WITH</b> Explanation of symptoms (strep throat, ear infection, etc. as determined by a provider)	May return to community day services after 24 hours of being fever free <b>AND</b> following our regular illness procedure, has a note from the medical provider stating the individual can return	N/A
Not Tested for COVID-19 <b>WITHOUT</b> Explanation of Symptoms	Must remain home for at least 10 days from the first day symptoms began <b>AND</b> have been fever free for 24 hours	N/A
Tested for COVID-19 and Results are Negative	Following our regular illness procedure, has a note from the medical provider stating the individual can return	May proceed with attending community day services as long as the individual has had no exposure to a positive case.
Tested for COVID-19 and Results are Positive	Must remain home for at least 10 days from the first day symptoms began, have been fever free for 24-hours <b>AND</b> has a note from the medical provider stating the individual can return	Isolate** at home for 14 days from the day the test was taken. If the individual develops symptoms, then isolation time starts on day 1 of symptoms.
Close Contact with Someone who has Tested Positive for COVID-19	<p>The individual must be tested.</p> <p>If positive: Must remain home for at least 10 days from the first day symptoms began, have been fever free for 24-hours <b>AND</b> has a note from the medical provider stating the individual can return.</p> <p>If negative: Following our regular illness procedure, has a note from the medical provider stating the individual can return</p> <p>This includes <b>ANYONE</b> you have been in contact with, including family, friends, peers/staff at community day services, etc.</p>	Quarantine* for 14 days before returning to community day services.

\* QUARANTINE keeps someone who was in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 away from others

\*\* ISOLATION keeps someone who is sick or tested positive for COVID-19 without symptoms away from others, even in their own home.
